- Prizes (gift cards & art kits) will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Place Contestants in each school category (see right).

### 2013 ADLC Art Contest - "HOW DO THE ARTS HELP ME GROW?" Rules:

- Submitted artwork must be original.
- Artworks must visually represent the answer to the question "How Do The Arts Strengthen Communities?"
- Entries should be either a coloured drawing or a painting. No photographs or computer-generated designs will be accepted. Any media, such as watercolor, oil, acrylic, pastel, pencil crayon, ink, collage, etc. are permitted.
- Submissions may be in vertical or horizontal format of any size, created on paper, canvas or art board. However, 18" x 24" is the preferred format.
- By entering into this contest, you permit ADLC to use your submissions, without limitations, at their sole discretion.
- Your name & date must be clearly indicated on the back of any of your submitted entry(s).
- You <u>must</u> complete and include the attached CONTEST SUBMISSION FORM, with your entry.





### Additional Contest Information:

- In addition to prizes being awarded for the top three entries in each category, ten submissions will be chosen to be displayed at the **Fine Arts Council Art Exhibition in February 2014**.
- Winning submissions will also be used as cover images for an ADLC Greeting Card.

#### All art works will be judged using the following criteria:

- Content: The artwork illustrates a narrative that is expressive and imaginative.
- **Creativity:** The artwork is innovative, completely original, well thought out, and thoroughly developed.
- **Composition:** The artwork demonstrates excellent understanding of composition incorporating several of the design elements and principals (line, shape, colour, balance, contrast, harmony, emphasis, movement, proportion, pattern, variety, unity, rhythm, repetition).
- **Craftsmanship:** The artwork reflects deliberate control of media and advanced craftsmanship. The artist shows an awareness of filling the space adequately, to create a unified composition.
